VENUE

The venue of the 2012 Intensive Leadership Camp is the SYL Center in Brgy. Candau-ay- with its basic accommodation- the center is decent for the leadership and academic learnings of all. All participants will be sleeping on the floors with cushions. Please provide your own blankets. The center has bobo style toilets and a communal baths to be able to learn greater flexibility and adaptability. Please bring comfortable clothing for bathing like swim suits, or simple used shirts and shorts. Participants will be cooking their meals as a group as well.

The SYL center is approximately 7 kilometers west of the city but is very accessible to public transportation. It is only 7 minutes away from 3 major hospitals-Silliman University Medical Center, Holy Child Hospital and the Negros Oriental Provincial Hospital. Facilitators and Staffs at SYL are all trained in paramedics and emergency and there are standby physicians as well.

SACEDA YOUTH LEAD

Empowering Leaders, Strengthening Communities

Saceda Youth Lead, a Youth Serving Institution of the Philippines under the auspices of the National Youth Commission, builds leadership through education and action. For 13 years now, it continues empowering elementary, high school and college students and even professionals to become most effective citizens of our country by providing them opportunities in leadership, community service and exchange. It is a recognized partner in youth development by the Team Energy, Asian Institute of Management, Department of Education, and the Commission on Higher Education. It is a member of the World Associations of NGO's of the United Nations, International Leadership Academy and the Innovations for Civic Engagements. It was awarded 2004 Ten Accomplished Youth Organizations of the Philippines for Visayas; 2005 National Award on Youth Empowerment and awarded Distinguished Service for Youth Leadership conferred by the HOBY Foundation during the World Leadership Congress, Washington DC, USA. Today, it has empowered more than 70,000 youths and teachers in all its programs and activities.

SYL has its own leadership center for its various trainings and programs with 2 session halls, dormitories, mess hall and courts. It adheres to simplicity and basic set up. It is located 7 kilometers west of Dumaguete and since then it has accommodated several provincial, regional, national and international leadership programs such as the Community Problem Project of the National Junior College, Ngee Ann Polytechnic, Republic of Singapore.

SYL has opened its own leadership high school- the Saceda Youth Lead School-the only leadership school in Negros Oriental. Now, it is operating on its 3rd year where students who come from poor backgrounds are given all the chances in life to become leaders of their own rights. The school offers 8 subjects with 2 electives- foreign language and leadership. It is the only school that has authentic academic and leadership exchange with another school abroad- Ngee Ann Polytechnic.

All in all, SYL runs 60 annual programs in training and development, ventures and international exchange. SYL is a self-sustained organization and is a recognized institution for youth leadership and development by the LDM-Institute for International Education, ICICP, Asia Europe Foundation, Ngee Ann Polytechnic of the Republic of Singapore, National Junior College and other universities and colleges in the Philippines and abroad.

SYL is chaired and founded by Dave G. Saceda, who was an Exchange Student at the International Christian University, Tokyo, Japan and graduated with a degree in Arts major in History and Sociology from Silliman University as Cum Laude.

He holds 4 Masters Programs: Certificate in Leadership from the Rizal Youth Leadership Institute; Certificate in South East Asian Studies from Silliman University; Certificate in General Academics from the State University of New York; Certificate in Gender, Repro Health and Sexuality from the University of San Carlos, Cebu City; He has a master's degree in Sociology from SU. He studied medicine and also finished his Doctor in Leadership. He is a graduate of the Executive Education Program of the Kennedy School, Harvard University.

His further trainings in leadership include: Consultant of Plan International, Southern Leyte, Consultant, OWWA Region 7, Lecturer on Leadership and Development-Asian Institute of Management, Panelist in the Global Summit on National Youth Service-Alexandria, Egypt and International Advisor on Youth Leadership for the Youth Expedition Project of Ngee Ann Polytechnic, the World Leadership Congress of the HOBY Foundation. His fields of expertise are: Strategic Planning, Team Effectiveness and Leadership, Conflict Management, Experiential Leadership Training and Emergency and Preventive Medicine.
