Greetings!

The *bonjing* staff, which includes the Health Services Office {led by the Reproductive Health and Wellness Center, RHWC and the City Population Office (CPO) and the Management Information Technology and Development (MITD) Division}, will be conducting the activities under the special project of bonjing entitled "**Bonjing creation, HIV reduction**". The team is led by Dr. Celia Flor C. Brillantes and Ms. Zenaida Quijana.

The first activity is the **Knowledge, Attitude, Skills and Habits (KASH) Survey on HIV/AIDS** among 10 public high schools in the city, tentatively dated on Oct. 15 to 19, 2012, 8:00 AM to 5:00 PM, which will use a bonjing-based questionnaire. This will require the team bonjing to move from one high school to another with the necessary supplies and laptop computers. There will be give-away prizes for the participating students who are randomly selected. The results will be presented during the Bonjing Congress. *Attached herewith is the sampling frame of the survey.*

The second activity is the **Bonjing Congress** to be held on Nov. 16, 2012 with a tentative venue at the Baguio Country Club where 150 students from the high school and colleges are invited to participate. The theme for the Congress is "Awareness to all Youth...Safeguarding their Future". There will be a logo and jingle-making contests (1-minute; any dialect and any instrument) around the main theme of bonjing "Moving Towards a Friendly Service to Young People". The logo will be used officially for bonjing website. We hope that the schools can pre-judge their entries to the contests.


You will be informed further of the plans on these activities.

In this connection, may we respectfully request your support in the above activities and to inform the high schools of their involvement in the KASH Survey that will be conducted tentatively next week. We will appreciate if the schools will allow us the use of their computers with internet connections. For the Bonjing Congress, we will inform you of the number of participants from each school not later than Oct. 31, 2012.

We highly appreciate your utmost support to the mission of *bonjing*.
