**ORDINANCE Numbered 42
(Series of 2013)**

ESTABLISHING AND DECLARING EVERY SECOND SUNDAY OF SEPTEMBER
OF EVERY YEAR AS **STUDENTS' DAY IN THE CITY OF BAGUIO**
AND ALLOCATING FUNDS FOR ITS CELEBRATION

Explanatory Note

On 11 September 2011, students of various schools in the City of Baguio participated in the launching of Students' Day in the city with the theme, "*I am a Hero. . . I respect, fulfill, and protect life*".

On the occasion of the celebration, the participating students and their schools submitted their endorsements of a draft resolution for the adoption of a students' day in the City of Baguio on the first Sunday of September of every year.

From the important whereas clauses of the draft resolution hereunder reproduced, the reasons and the mechanics for the celebration can be appreciated and seen, as follows:

"The City of Baguio is an educational center of Northern Luzon that promotes excellence in all aspects of life of the student – academics, health, religion, citizenship and mental well-being.

"The students of Baguio City are comprised of 14 percent residents of Baguio, 15 percent residents of Benguet, and 70 percent of transient residents from different regions of the Philippines.

"The students of Baguio City contribute to the development of the community and the nation by way of priming the economy, participating in civic and spiritual action and abiding by its laws.

"It is desirable for the City of Baguio to affirm the economic, social, educational, and spiritual contribution of the students and to support and protect the general welfare and rights of the students.

"To sustain and recognize excellence in the behavior of students and promote their general welfare, it is necessary to institutionalize a Baguio City Students' Day on the first Sunday of September as part of the Baguio City Charter Day celebration.

"Pursuant to the observance of the Baguio City Students' Day, an annual program of activities shall be prepared and implemented with the Baguio City School Board as lead organization assisted by the Commission on Higher Education, Department of Education Division Office, National Youth Commission, National Service Training Program (NSTP) advisers, non-government organizations, and other civic organizations."

Confronted with the observance of an International Students' Day celebrated every 17th day of November of every year and of House Bill No. 3677 which intends to adopt November 17 of every year as National Students' Day, the participating students through the event coordinators explained that the proposed National Students' Day and the International Students' Day are more focused on commemorations of student leaders' efforts while their envisioned students' day will be festive and oriented to students' participation in the development of the city.

With Baguio Day being celebrated on the 1st day of September of every year and with the possibility that the same may fall on the 1st Sunday of the month, the participating students acceded to having students' day in the City of Baguio on the 2nd Sunday of September every year instead of being on the first Sunday of the month as proposed.

NOW, THEREFORE, on motion of Hon. Olowan, Hon. Fianza, and Hon. Cosalan, seconded by Hon. Tabanda, Hon. L. B. Yangot Jr., Hon. Alangsab, Hon. Bagbagen, and Hon. Aliping,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE SANGGUNIANG PANLUNGSOD (CITY COUNCIL) IN SESSION ASSEMBLED THAT:

SECTION 1. This Ordinance shall be known as the **STUDENTS' DAY IN THE CITY OF BAGUIO ORDINANCE**.

SECTION 2. The second Sunday of September of every year is hereby established and declared as Students' Day in the City of Baguio.

SECTION 3. For the observance of Students' Day, the amount of P50,000.00 shall be allocated every year from the general fund to be included in the budget of the City Administrator's Office for the implementation of institutionalized activities in the City of Baguio which shall be spent in accordance with the program of activities to be prepared by the Students' Day Committee to be created for the purpose, composed of representatives from the Local School Board, the Department of Education Division Office, the Commission on Higher Education, schools, students, and concerned agencies, groups or organizations.

SECTION 4. Separability Clause. If, for any reason or reasons, any part or provision of this Ordinance shall be held to be unconstitutional or invalid, the other parts or provisions hereof which are not affected thereby shall continue to be in full force and effect.


SECTION 5. Repealing Clause. All ordinances, resolutions, and regulations or part or parts thereof which are inconsistent with this Ordinance are hereby repealed and/or modified accordingly.

SECTION 6. Effectivity Clause. This Ordinance shall take effect in accordance with the provisions of the Local Government Code of 1991.

SECTION 7. This Ordinance shall take effect in accordance with the provisions of the Local Government Code of 1991.




