1. The Department of Education (DepEd), through the National Testing and Research Center (NETRC) shall administer the National Achievement Test (NAT) nationwide as contained in the enclosure of DepEd Order No. 10, s. 2013 entitled School Calendar for School Year (SY) 2013-2014 on the following dates::

Date	Grade/Year Level of Examinee
March 5, 2014	Fourth Year high school students of public and private schools (census)
March 11, 2014	Grade 3 pupils of public and Madrasah schools
March 13, 2014	Grade 6 pupils of public and private schools (census)

- 2. All Public elementary and secondary schools from this Department shall be included in the conduct of the test. However, the following are exempted from taking the NAT:
 - a. Classes of behavioral programs and home study programs;
 - b. Private schools using the American Standard Curriculum
 - c. Foreign students who are newly-enrolled;
 - d. Students with Intellectual Disability and Visual Impairment;
 - e. Irregular students with back subjects; and
 - f. Students in night classes.
- 3. Each examinee in NAT (Grade 6) shall be issued with a Certificate of Rating (COR) containing the actual rating per subject area. The COR will reflect the examinee's readiness for high school.
- 4. Relative to this, all Public Elementary and Secondary School Heads and All PSDS are required to attend the Division Conference at Manuel L. Quezon Elementary Hall on February 19, 2014 at 8:00 AM.
