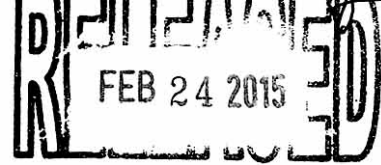

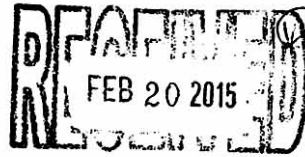

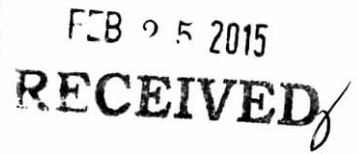

Registration fee to this annual event is **P6,000** to defray the cost of food and accommodation for the entire duration of the camp, kits, certificates, uniform T-shirts and for other related expenses. Teacher participants will earn 9 units in the MA Education/ Master in Social Studies as the summer camp modular program has equivalency in the graduate program in education all over the Philippines. The granting institution is Negros Oriental State University. All interested teachers will need to add P7,000 to be enrolled in this program.



Overview:

This training will allow the participant to understand his or her strengths and weaknesses, allowing him/her to interact meaningfully with other leaders, individuals and group. This training includes new curriculum in personal and global leadership management perspectives with strong emphasis on teamwork and interpersonal skills, greater flexibility and exposure to solving real-world problems through leadership workshops and group dynamics.


Objectives:

The 2015 SYL National Summer Leadership Camp aims to:

- (1) Awaken their giants within through series of workshops and dynamics of the summer camp.
- (2) Expose students to current trends and concepts in leadership through interaction and lectures;

Today, it has its own leadership center for its various trainings and programs. It has opened its own leadership high school in Dumaguete-the only leadership school in Negros Oriental. It runs 60 annual programs in training and development, ventures and international exchange. SYL is a self-sustained organization and is a recognized institution for youth leadership and development by the LDM-Institute for International Education, ICICP, Asia Europe Foundation, Ngee Ann Polytechnic of the Republic of Singapore, National Junior College and other universities and colleges in the Philippines and abroad.

SYL is chaired and founded by Dave G. Saceda who was an Exchange Student at the International Christian University, Tokyo, Japan and graduated with a degree in Arts major in History and Sociology from Silliman University as Cum Laude. He holds 4 Masters Programs: Certificate in Leadership from the Rizal Youth Leadership Institute; Certificate in South East Asian Studies from Silliman University; Certificate in General Academics from the State University of New York; Certificate in Gender, Repro Health and Sexuality from the University of San Carlos, Cebu City; He has a master's degree in Sociology from SU. He also finished his Executive Education Program from the John F. Kennedy School of Government from Harvard University.
