Date : February 17, 2015

1. A division **Panagbenga 2015 Flower Arrangement Contest** for pupils, students and Teachers will be held on March 6, 2015 at the Baguio City National High School Auditorium. Registration will start at 8:00 am and the contest proper will start at 9:00 o'clock am.

This Flower Arrangement contest is open to all elementary pupils & teachers and high school students & teachers of public and private schools.

2. The objectives of the **Panagbenga 2015 Flower Arrangement Contest** are as follows:
 - a. To showcase DepEd people's talents & skills in the Flower Arrangement Contest as an expression of the arts.
 - c. To provide opportunities for educators, students and pupils to develop a sense of appreciation towards arts, culture, nature and the environment.
 - d. To demonstrate that Schools, as part of the community still carry and uphold the same reputation of being able to support the ideals of Panagbenga through its participation in the City wide celebration of Panagbenga 2015.
3. There are two (2) categories for this contest:
 - a. Dish Garden for high school teachers and students
 - b. Centerpiece Design for Elementary Teachers and Pupils

DISH GARDEN

THEME: The Herb Dish Garden (This is only an example of the Theme – can be modified)

**Live, Individual
Professional/Student, Individual**

Professional and student participants are to set-up and display within one hour a miniature garden following the theme. The Herb dish garden shall be displayed as a centerpiece in a round table good for 10 pax or a rectangular table good for 8 pax (your choice). A secret herb material will be provided. Correctness, proper use of materials and artful presentation will have great impact on scores. **One hour (1.0 hr.) to finish the art.**

SPECIFIC GUIDELINES

1. Except for the secret material/materials, all materials for this competition will be provided by the participant. This material shall be incorporated at the design, either as an accent, featured or focal point material taking into consideration the theme of this category.
2. Pots size or container size should **not be less than 12”** in diameter (round) or 12” length for square / rectangle container and not more than 18” in diameter or length.
3. Design of the dish garden is required. Please submit the design in 5 copies to the event coordinator during briefing. The story board will be displayed beside the dish garden art.
4. Height of art should not be more than 24”.
5. Natural mix materials to be used. Plastic flowers or foliage will not be allowed.
6. Use of wood, twigs, stone, small water pumps, may be used.
7. Other adhesives like glue, artist paints can be used.
8. Bonsai plants, cactus and other live plants can be used.
9. The coordinator will brief participants an hour before the competition.
10. Contestants are required to bring their own tools: side cutter, scissors, floral foam, etc.
11. Design is required to be submitted to the event coordinator during the briefing with the competitors badge number.

CENTERPIECE DESIGN – LOBBY

THEME: WHITES & LAVENDER

**Live, Team - 2
 Professional/Student**

Professional and student participants are to set-up and display within **one hour** a centerpiece for display at a lobby. Balance and symmetry of materials to the overall design impacts scores.

SPECIFIC GUIDELINES

1. Raw materials are fruits, vegetables, flowers, dried flowers, sticks, and other indigenous materials, however, the specific color to be used for flowers will be **WHITES & LAVENDER**. Complementing flower colors can be used provided that they will not overpower the theme as **color** plays an important role.
2. A name for the finished art is recommended.
3. Vase material, floral foam may be prepared but not done. Assembly should be on site,
4. Space allotted: 70 cm x 70 cm x 70 cm; no height restriction but balance should be achieved.
5. Participants can use lighting effects. The participant must provide the bulbs to be used.
6. _____ will provide outlets under the display table, Participants are required to check outlets and inform coordinator that lighting effects will be used.
7. Number of hours to finish the centerpiece for lobby 1.5 hours; 30 minutes for judging.
8. It is recommended that the competitor provide their table if their design requires them a specific table to be used. _____ will provide its standard banquet table. Corresponding table cloth to be used to enhance the arrangement will be used.

1. There will be two designs for the flower arrangement competition; Dish Garden for High School Category both teachers and students and centerpiece Design (Lobby) for the Elementary Category for both teachers and pupils
2. Elimination will be done by schools for BAGUIO CITY NATIONAL HIGH SCHOOL, PINES CITY NATIONAL HIGH SCHOOL AND IRISAN NATIONAL HIGH SCHOOL, 3 finalists from BCNHS, 2 for PCNHS and 1 for INHS.
3. Cluster 1 and 2 of newly Legislated High Schools will chose only 3 finalists.
4. 3 finalists for each Elementary district only.
5. Top 3 for both teacher and student category will be given Trophies and Cash prizes during the awarding ceremonies on March 8, 2015 at the Athletic Bowl.
6. Certificates of Participation will be given to all the participants
