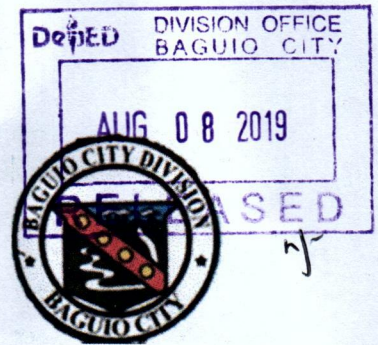

**REITERATION OF REGIONAL MEMORANDUM NO. 019 s. 2018: PREVENTING DENGUE H-FEVER AND OTHER MOSQUITO BORNE DISEASES IN SCHOOLS**

**To:** Public School District Supervisors  
Elementary and Secondary Public School Heads/Principals  
Public School Administrators  
School Health and Nutrition Personnel  
All Others Concerned

1. In response to the Nationwide Dengue Alert declared by the Department of Health (DOH) last July 15, 2019 where the Cordillera Administrative Region (CAR) is one of the closely monitored regions after exceeding the alert threshold, The Schools Division of Baguio City reiterates *RM No. 019 s. 2018, "Preventing Dengue H-Fever and other Mosquito Borne Diseases in Schools"* especially items no. 2 and 3.
  2. *School Officials are enjoined to mobilize all school personnel to observe the 4S against Dengue and other mosquito borne disease:*
    - a. *Seek and destroy possible mosquito breeding sites*
    - b. *Self-Protection*
    - c. *Say No to indiscriminate fogging. (Say Yes if there is an impending outbreak)*
    - d. *Seek early consultation )on the first signs and) if symptoms persist.*
  3. *DepEd Memorandum No. 377 s. 2010 reiterates close collaboration with PTA/PTCA, Local Government Units and City Health Services Office in conducting the following:*
    - a. *Information campaign against Dengue H-fever and other mosquito borne diseases*
    - b. *Maintenance of environmental sanitation in schools and communities*
    - c. *Referral of learners and DepEd employees with symptoms of dengue, and*
    - d. *Relay to local health officials reports about dengue cases among students or teachers for quick response (Preventive Alert in Schools)*
2. All learners with fever for one (1) day or more are mandated to be sent home with parents until condition improves. If symptoms persist, parents are advised to seek medical consult in hospitals, health centers or private medical practitioners. All personnel who are experiencing fever are also advised to rest at home and seek medical consult if symptoms persist.
3. School heads are requested to create internal policies with regards wearing of uniforms, regular clean-up drives, classroom information drives, and others for the protection of their learners and personnel against the dengue mosquito.
4. For immediate dissemination and compliance.
