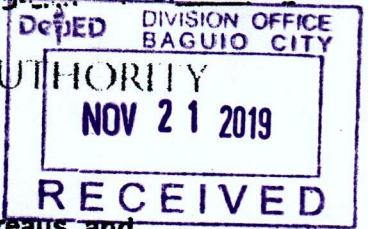

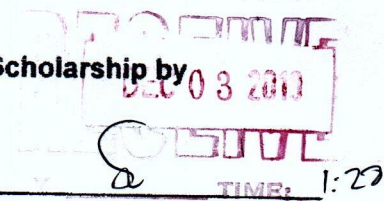


MEMORANDUM

1. Further to our earlier memorandum dated September 2, 2019 (copy attached), we would like to invite your Office to nominate candidates to the 2-year Master's Degree program for Japanese Academic Years (AY) 2020 and 2021, and 3-year Ph.D. program covering AY2020 to AY2022 under the subject Project. Since its inception in 2003, the JDS Project has dispatched more than 300 fellows from different Philippine Government agencies and organizations to various prestigious Japanese universities.
2. Twenty (20) fellows from various Philippine Government agencies will be dispatched in AY2020 to undertake master's degree programs while two (2) fellows will be dispatched to take doctoral degree programs in Japanese universities.
3. The deadline for submission of the candidates' nominations with their application documents is **on December 6, 2019 for master's degree applications and December 27, 2019 for doctoral degree applications.** May we reiterate the following important reminders:

Vecina) and the Commission on Higher Education (CHED) – International Affairs Office (c/o Director Lily Freida T. Macabangun-Milla), respectively; and,
 - c. Late submission and incomplete application documents will NOT be accepted.

- Currently employed in the Philippine Government with permanent status for more than two-years after completion of the master degree program.

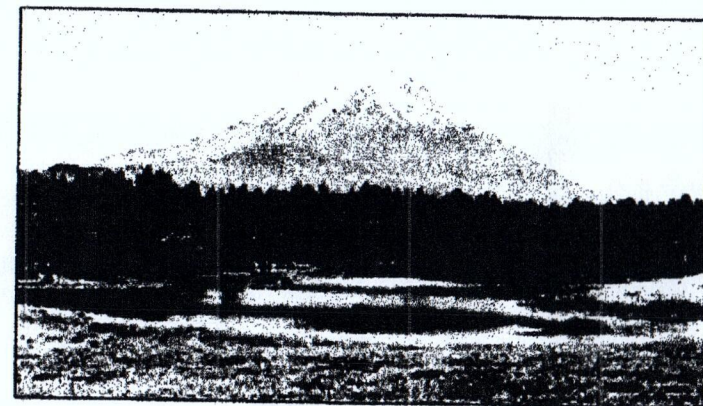

What is the JDS

The Project for Human Resource Development Scholarship by Japanese Grant Aid (JDS) was established by the Government of the Philippines with the assistance of the Government of Japan for JFY2002. The objective of JDS is to support human resources development of the Philippines, targeting young officials, who are expected to be leaders of the country, and to engage in formulating and implementing social and economic development policies after returned. Participants of the JDS Project shall contribute to an expanded and enhanced foundation for bilateral relations with Japan as persons having well knowledge of Japan.

Fields of Study

The framework of the JDS Project consists of "Sub-Program" and "Component", which correspond to and deal with the selected target priority area and development issues of the Philippines. The participants are selected in consideration of relevance to the "sub-program." Accepting Japanese university offers educational programs corresponded to the needs. The degree to be obtained is Master's degree. The medium of instruction is English.

Eligible Applicants 1)~3), 5)~7) to be applied generally

- 1) Citizens of the Republic of the Philippines;
- 2) Between 22 and 39 years old as of April 1, 2020;
- 3) Must be an employee of the Philippine Government and not a member of the military;
- 4) Currently employed with permanent status and 2 years of work experience in duties particularly relevant to the selected Component, at the time of application;
- 5) Possess a bachelor degree relevant to the target fields;
- 6) Have a performance rating of at least "Very Satisfactory" from July 1, 2018 to June 30, 2019;
- 7) Have not been awarded any other foreign scholarships for obtaining a master's degree.

Benefits of JDS Participants

- (1) One round trip airfare between the Philippines and Japan
- (2) Monthly living allowance in Japan
- (3) Full tuition fees of accepting universities
- (4) Other designated allowances (field study, etc.)

Selection Process

- 1) Academic Aptitude Test on November to December 2019
- 2) Screening Documentation by each Accepting University on January 2020
- 3) Technical Interview with the Japanese professors on February 2020
- 4) Comprehensive Interview with the OC members on March 2020
