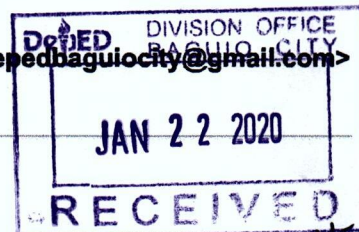

The Social Science Research and Extension Institute (SSREI) of the College of Social Sciences, University of the Philippines Baguio is pleased to invite you and members of your institution to the **Teaching Philippine History** seminar, which will be held on **07-08 February 2020** at the College of Social Sciences Audio Visual Room, University of the Philippines Baguio, Baguio City.

The SSREI is the extension arm of the College of Social Sciences, University of the Philippines Baguio that offers Social Sciences and Philosophy teaching and/or research training services, to educators, graduate students, and development workers from GOs and NGOs in the country. SSREI was originally called Summer Research Institute (SRI) and was held during the months of April and May. In both its earlier forms as SRI and SSRI, the focus of extension work was research training. This was later revised as the types of services that could be offered expanded and the period these services could be offered was extended. This resulted to the addition of the term 'Extension' to its name, thus the current name Social Science Research and Extension Institute (SSREI). Since its institution, the program has trained and updated academics, GO and NGO workers on the latest developments in research approaches and methodologies, as well as developments in theory, practice, knowledge, and pedagogy in the area of Social Sciences and Philosophy.

Teaching Philippine History, the first in a series of seminars organized by the SSREI this academic year, aims to provide the seminar participants an overview of historical perspectives, historical sources, and pedagogical insights on Philippine history from the pre-colonial to the contemporary period. Continuing education and dialogue on the teaching of Philippine History is imperative if we have to make the delivery of instruction relevant. The seminar has the following objectives:

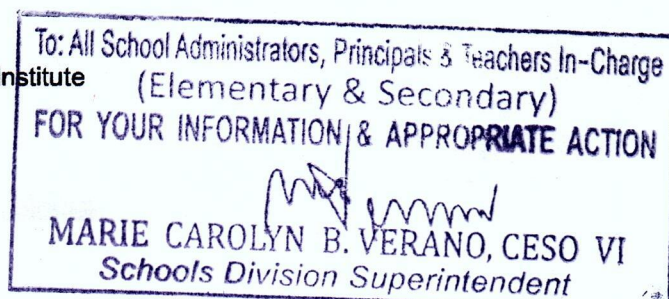

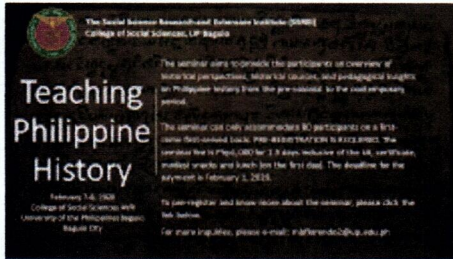

The study of the past has been integral to social studies and other subject areas under the K-12 Program of the Department of Education (Dep-Ed).
