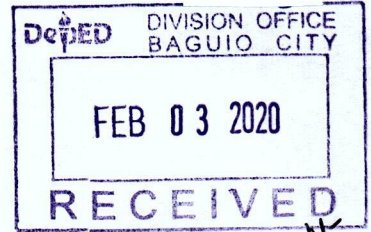

We are pleased to announce that the simultaneous conduct of the **Seniors and Juniors 33<sup>rd</sup> Council Camp** will be held on **March 26-28, 2020** at **Ating Tahanan, National Program and Training Center, South Drive, Baguio City**. The theme is **"STRENGTHENING OUR GIRL SCOUT COMRADERIES THROUGH OUTDOOR ACTIVITIES"**

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**PARTICIPANTS:**

All interested Twinkler, Star, Junior, Senior, Cadet Scouts registered for school year 2019-2020

**PAYMENT OF REGISTERED FEES OF CAMPERS:**

a. The camp fee for **Junior, Senior and Cadet Scouts** is **ONE THOUSAND FIVE HUNDRED FIFTY PESOS (P1,500.00)** per camper inclusive of camp miscellaneous fee, program materials, camp ID's, certificates and activity badges.

b. The camp fee for **Twinkler and Star Level Day Campers** is **FIVE HUNDRED PESOS (P500.00)** per camper inclusive of camp miscellaneous fee, program materials, certificates and activity badges, camp souvenir, am snack. Day Campers will be have their activity on **March 27, 2020, at Onjon ni Ivadoy (Heritage Park), Burnham Park, Baguio City (Near Children's Park)**. **Orientation will be at 7:30am and Activity Program starts at 8:00am to 12nn.**

<b>Attire:</b>	<b>Twinkler Scouts</b>	<b>official uniform</b> including their <b>active uniform</b> inside their official uniform.
	<b>Star Scouts</b>	<b>Active Uniform</b> (GSP official cap, yellow scarf, GSP T-shirt and GSP jogging pants/School jogging pants)

c. The camp fee for the **Chaperons and Other Adult Campers** is **EIGHT HUNDRED PESOS (P800.00)** per camper inclusive of camp miscellaneous fee, 6 meals (**1<sup>st</sup> meal is dinner of March 26, and last meal is lunch for March 28**), and certificates.

d. **Advanced payment of P850.00 and application forms should be given on or before February 7, 2020 and full payment should be paid on or before March 3, 2020.**

## QUALIFICATIONS OF PARTICIPANTS:

### Camper's Qualifications:

#### Girls

1. Must be a registered Girl Scout for the year 2019-2020
2. Must have earned badges in the 8-Point Challenge.
3. Must be able to live by the GS Promise and law.
4. Must be emotionally stable and physically fit with Medical Certificate.
5. Have attended Troop Camp/District Camp
6. Knows the Basic knots, how to make gadgets and out-door cooking.
7. **A group must have a minimum of six (6) members and a maximum of eight (8) members.**

#### Adults

1. Must be a duly registered Troop Leader with atleast have Camp Craft Certificate.
2. She must be able to live by the GS promise and law.
3. Must be emotionally stable and physically fit with Medical Certificate.
4. Have an out-door trainings/Updates.
5. **Must have a Campcraft Certificate.**

## ARRIVAL IN CAMP:

- a. The campers are expected to arrive in camp on **Thursday, March 26, 2020.** Registration starts at 6:30 am to 7:30 am. **Camp Program Opening and Camp Orientation will be at 7:30am. First Day activity starts at 9am.**

## FOOD MANAGEMENT:

- a) **Campers are expected to prepare and cook their own lunch on the first day (March 26) of the camp and the snack or delicacies they will present at the Barrio Fiesta Festival in the afternoon.**
- b. Campers should bring their individual eating utensils for each patrol.
- c. Charcoal stove and charcoals is the only allowed for cooking their foods. If campers wish to order a charcoal stove, please place your order on **February 21, 2020 or contact us at (074)442-2096 or CP No. 0920-3916-890**

## GADGETS WOODS:

- a. Campers should bring their own twines or straw for lashing.
- b. No bringing of mono block table or chair for Patrol Kitchen.

## TENTS:

A Patrol tent (good for 8 girls) is highly suggested for a better camp lay-out.

## CELLPHONE:

Cellphone/gadgets are not allowed in the camp, only the chaperons and camp staffs are allowed to use gadgets for camp activity and receive important messages only. You will only use your gadgets for your activities, if needed.



**OPEN CAMP:**

Parents/Guardians are only allowed in camp in a certain area during the registration time 7:00am-10:00am and last day in the afternoon after the closing program at 1:00pm.

**CHAPERONS:**

All official chaperons of campers are required to attend the Council Troop Leaders and Other Adult Members Forum to maximize their time during the camp.

**Attached is the Proposed Day to Day program of Activities for your reference.**

**THINGS TO BRING:**

These should be brought by the individual campers and **packed in a 1 duffle bag and 1 backpack/knapsack** provided with luggage tag. Travel Luggage and/or Trolley Bags (Maleta) will not be allowed inside the camp. Please note no other bags to hold, see to it that you can carry alone your luggage travel light.

**For Personal Things (Travel Light):**

1. 1 Complete Official Uniforms (please refer to Dress Code)
2. 3 Logo shirts and 2 extra shirt
3. 2 GSP jogging pants/Sch. Jogging pants
4. Under wears, towel (thin), face towel
5. Personal effects & toiletries
6. 1 Light Jacket and 1 Winter Jacket to be worn
7. Sleeping bag/bedroll (No bringing of pillows)
8. Sleeping garment (suggest to wear thick comfortable jogging pants and sweatshirt due to the cold temperature during night time)
9. Rubber shoes/sneakers
10. Rubber slippers, sit upon
11. Light rain coat, umbrella
12. Prescribed medicines
13. Flashlight and insect repellent/sun tan lotion
14. Camera (optional)
15. Pen, Art Materials, whistle, compass and Swiss knife
16. Personalized friendship tokens for the monita day (March 27, 2020)
17. Lunch Boxes, 750ml drinking water bottle container
18. Bonnet, muffler, hand and foot warmer

**For Patrols:**

1. 1 Patrol Tent (1 tent for 6-8 girls & 1 adult only)
2. Water container with faucet
3. Thermos and mugs for hot beverage
4. 2pcs. Pail and 2pcs. bucket (1 for kitchen, 1 for latrine)
5. First Aid kit
6. Only charcoal stove will be allowed to cook your food on March 27 only
7. Charcoal for cooking only
8. 2 Tulda for Fly Tent for kitchen and wide enough for your patrol latrine
9. Garbage bags for 3 days
10. (No mono blocks allowed)
11. 1 pcs. Emergency Lamp for Quarters, dining and kitchen.
12. Screen for roasting foods
13. "Anirola"
14. basin
15. Dishwashing soap, sponge

**COLOR TAGS FOR LAGUAGE BY SUBCAMP:**



- SENIOR SCOUTS - BLUE


