**ORDINANCE Numbered 40  
(Series of 2021)**

AMENDING CERTAIN PROVISIONS OF ORDINANCE NUMBERED 66, SERIES OF 2016 [PROVIDING FOR THE PREVENTION AND CONTROL MEASURES TO MITIGATE DENGUE CASES IN THE CITY OF BAGUIO, REQUIRING ALL RESIDENTS TO STRENGTHEN THE FIGHT AGAINST DENGUE, APPROPRIATING FUNDS THEREFOR, AND PRESCRIBING PENALTIES FOR VIOLATIONS THEREOF, OTHERWISE KNOWN AS "ANTI-DENGUE ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF BAGUIO"].

**Explanatory Note**

In her 1<sup>st</sup> Indorsement dated 14 November 2019, City Health Services Officer, Dr. Rowena P. Galpo, MD MPH, transmitted the Memorandum of Engineer Charles Bryan C. Carame, Engineer IV, Sanitation Division, City Health Services Office, recommending incorporation/institutionalization for sustainability the provisions of Memorandum Circular No. 2012-16 [*Aksyon Barangay Kontra Dengue (ABKD)*] and Memorandum Circular No. 2019-130 [Advocacy on the Prevention of Dengue and Other Mosquito-Borne Diseases], both issued by the Department of the Interior and Local Government, into Ordinance Numbered 66, Series of 2016 [Providing for the Prevention and Control Measures to Mitigate Dengue Cases in the City of Baguio, Requiring All Residents to Strengthen the Fight Against Dengue, Appropriating Funds Therefor, and Prescribing Penalties for Violations Thereof, Otherwise Known as "Anti-Dengue Ordinance of the City of Baguio"].

Said provisions of the above issuances are vital in the implementation, monitoring and evaluation of various anti-Dengue activities at the local government unit and barangay level; provide for the Ordinance's implementation procedure; forge and strengthen partnership with the Department of Education for the full and regular implementation of 4S (Search and Destroy breeding sites; Seek Early Consultation; Self-Protect; and Say Yes to Fogging only in hotspot areas) programs not only in public but also in private schools and universities.

NOW, THEREFORE, on motion of Hon. Alangsab, Hon. Bomogao and Hon. Orcales, duly seconded,



BE IT ORDAINED BY THE *SANGGUNIANG PANLUNGSOD* (CITY COUNCIL) IN SESSION ASSEMBLED THAT:

SECTION 1. Section 9A is hereby added to Ordinance Numbered 66, Series of 2016, to read as follows:

**“SECTION 9A. – The policies provided under the Department of the Interior and Local Government (DILG) Memorandum Circular No. 2012-16 [Aksyon Barangay Kontra Dengue (ABKD)] are hereby adopted, thus, the City Mayor shall ensure that the following are carried out:**

**a. By the Punong Barangay:**

- 1. Intensify the conduct of clean-up drive in the barangay through mobilization of volunteers, residents and the Barangay Health Teams (i.e. Barangay Health Workers (BHW), Barangay Nutrition Scholars (BNS), Barangay Health Emergency Response Teams (BHERTs)) and Barangay Tanods;**
- 2. Conduct information campaign relative to the mosquito ovidical/larvicidal trap (OL-Trap) system of the Department of Science and Technology (DOST) through its Industrial Technology Development Institute (ITDI) as a strategy to control and detect impending dengue outbreaks;**
- 3. Assist in the identification of distribution centers or stores for OL-Trap kits;**
- 4. Mobilize the Barangay Health Teams as distribution agents of OL-Trap products;**
- 5. Submit to the City Mayor’s Office and the Sangguniang Panlungsod (City Council) of Baguio corresponding reports on their performance on dengue control and prevention on a quarterly basis; and**
- 6. Allocate funds to sustain the continuous supply of OL-Trap materials for free to their barangay constituents.**


**b. By the City Health Services Office (CHSO):**

- 1. Conduct massive information campaign relative to the OL-Trap system as a strategy to control and detect impending dengue outbreaks;**
- 2. Monitor health situation;**
- 3. Provide data on dengue cases to partner agencies;**
- 4. Extend technical assistance in the conduct of training and orientation relative to dengue prevention and control;**
- 5. Devise a scheme of providing support fund to ensure sustainability of dengue prevention and control;**
- 6. Ensure the dengue patients are provided with timely and proper medical attention; and**
- 7. Submit to the City Mayor’s Office and the Sangguniang Panlungsod (City Council) of Baguio corresponding reports on their performance on dengue control and prevention on a quarterly basis.”**

SECTION 2. Section 9B is hereby added to Ordinance Numbered 66, Series of 2016, to read as follows:

**“SECTION 9B. – The policies provided under the Department of the Interior and Local Government (DILG) Memorandum Circular No. 2019-130 [Advocacy on the Prevention of Dengue and Other Mosquito-Borne Diseases] are hereby adopted, thus:**

**“9B.1. Purpose. – The purpose of this policy is to ensure that Local Government Units (LGUs) comply with the Department of Health’s (DOH) Enhanced 4S (Search and Destroy breeding sites; Seek Early Consultation; Self-Protect; and Say Yes to Fogging only in hotspot areas) Strategy against dengue and other mosquito-borne diseases, as well as, encourage them to introduce mechanisms to prevent and control the spread of the virus.**





**“9B.2. Policy Content and Guidelines. – The Local Chief Executive, shall:**

- a. **Ensure the implementation of the DOH’s Enhanced 4S Strategy which is a prevention and control strategy against Aedes-borne diseases, specifically dengue, chikungunya, and Zika viruses;**
- b. **To forge and strengthen partnership with the Department of Education (DepEd), the Commission on Higher Education (CHED), and all public and private schools and universities for the full implementation of the DOH’s Enhanced 4S Strategy;**
- c. **Activate the Aksyon Barangay Kontra Dengue (ABKD) per Department of the Interior and Local Government (DILG) Memorandum Circular No. 2012-016 [Aksyon Barangay Kontra Dengue (ABKD)] dated 30 January 2012;**
- d. **Synchronize the conduct of the 4:00 o’clock Habit Para Deng-Get Out activities, or the simultaneous cleaning of household and community surroundings, getting rid of stagnant water and other mosquito-breeding sites, and conducting measures to prevent water stagnation every day at 4:00 o’clock in the afternoon;**
- e. **Facilitate chemical interventions, such as spraying and larviciding (or the regular application of microbial or chemical insecticides to water bodies or water containers to kill mosquito larvae and pupae);**
- f. **Implement the DOH’s “Checklist for Dengue Epidemic Preparedness and Response for Local Government Units”;**
- g. **Ensure that all concerned institutions under their respective jurisdiction implement all actions based in the DOH’s “Checklist for Dengue Epidemic Preparedness and Response for Schools (Public and Private) and City Health Offices”;**
- h. **Coordinate closely with their respective DOH Regional Office-Center for Health Development;**
- i. **Reproduce DOH-provided Information Education Campaign materials and disseminate them to the communities;**
- j. **Oversee the preparedness of City Health Offices and Local Government Unit-operated hospitals by ensuring the consistent availability of adequate logistics, such as Oresol, non-structural protein 1-based rapid diagnostic test (NS1 RDT), larvicides, medicines, et cetera;**
- k. **Provide emergency transport for patients during referrals; and**
- l. **Encourage residents to observe early consultations.”**

SECTION 3. Section 22 of Ordinance Numbered 66, Series of 2016 is hereby amended, to read as follows:

*“SECTION 22. Funding. – All concerned agencies, offices, and departments shall set aside funds necessary to implement the duties and functions defined from their annual budgets, all subject to accounting and auditing rules and regulations.*

**“The City Government of Baguio, as well as the 128 barangays of the City, may utilize part of the 70% allocation for disaster preparedness and part of the 30% Quick Response Fund from the Local Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Fund, subject to the usual accounting and auditing rules and regulations. Use of said funds must likewise be in accordance with the Joint Memorandum Circular No. 2013-1 [Allocation and Utilization of Local Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Fund (LDRRMF)] of the National Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Council (NDRRMC), the Department of Budget and Management (DBM), and the Department of the Interior and Local Government (DILG), dated 25 March 2013.”**





**Ordinance Numbered 40, Series of 2021, page 4.**

SECTION 4. Section 23 of Ordinance Numbered 66, Series of 2016 is hereby amended, to read as follows:

*"SECTION 23. Education and Information Dissemination. – The City Health Services Office in coordination with the Department of Health-Cordillera Administrative Region, the Liga ng mga Barangay, and the 128 barangays, shall conduct massive public awareness campaigns which include, but not limited to, health education including the organization/coordination of lectures, manner of destroying breeding sites, prevention and control, and information dissemination of the anti-dengue programs.*

*"The Public Information Office of the City Government of Baguio and the Information Officer of the Sangguniang Panlungsod shall facilitate the dissemination of the Ordinance through quad media.*

*"The barangays shall ensure the dissemination of this Ordinance to its constituents.*

**"All activities should be documented properly, and the reports submitted to the City Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Office (CDRRMO) and the Regional Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Office (RDRRMO) for consolidation, furnishing a copy of the regional consolidated report to the regional offices of the Department of Health (DOH) and the Department of the Interior and Local Government (DILG)."**

SECTION 5. This Ordinance shall take effect in accordance with the provisions of Republic Act No. 7160, also known as the Local Government Code of 1991, as amended.



**RESOLUTION Numbered 121  
(Series of 2021)**

DIRECTING THE SINGING OF BAGUIO HYMN AND BAGUIO MARCH IN ALL ACTIVITIES CELEBRATED WITHIN THE CITY OF BAGUIO OTHER THAN THOSE SPECIFIED UNDER SECTIONS 2 AND 3 OF ORDINANCE NUMBERED 052, SERIES OF 1993 [FORMALLY ADOPTING AND DECLARING THE MUSICAL COMPOSITIONS ENTITLED, "*BAGUIO: HAVEN FOR ALL*" AND "*BEAUTIFUL BAGUIO*" AS THE OFFICIAL BAGUIO HYMN AND BAGUIO MARCH, RESPECTIVELY].

WHEREAS, Resolution Numbered 256, Series of 1991 has required the singing of Baguio Hymn during flag raising ceremonies in all public and private schools in the city immediately after the singing or playing of the Philippine National Anthem; before the start of the regular session of the *Sangguniang Panlungsod* (City Council) of Baguio; official programs; and special activities such as those observed during the Independence Day and Baguio Day which are all sponsored or initiated by the City Government of Baguio;

WHEREAS, Ordinance Numbered 052, Series of 1993 has formally adopted and declared the Musical Compositions, entitled "*Baguio: Haven for All*" and "*Beautiful Baguio*" as the official Baguio Hymn and Baguio March, respectively, and directed the singing of the same at appropriate intervals in all official programs and special activities initiated or sponsored by the City Government of Baguio, including flag raising ceremonies and parades, in public offices and in public and private schools in the City of Baguio;

WHEREAS, the said Ordinance did not disturb the order of singing of the Baguio Hymn right after the National Anthem established under Resolution Numbered 256, Series of 1991;

WHEREAS, under Rule III, Section I of Resolution Numbered 254, Series of 2004 [A Resolution Providing for a Codified and Revised Internal Rules of Procedure for the *Sangguniang Panlungsod* of Baguio City], a different order of singing was prescribed as the Baguio March is sung before the Baguio Hymn;

WHEREAS, consistent with Resolution Numbered 256, Series of 1991, Baguio Hymn should be sung after the National Anthem and the Baguio March shall be sung thereafter at any time as part of the program or activity;

WHEREAS, singing or playing of Baguio Hymn and Baguio March will definitely boost one's pride to being identified as a Baguio City resident and will certainly promote patriotism and camaraderie; and

WHEREAS, the singing and playing of Baguio Hymn and Baguio March is hereby directed in all activities within the City of Baguio that will involve the singing or playing of the *Pambansang Awit* or of the *Ang Bayan Kong Pilipinas* or other patriotic songs which shall include, but not limited to, the following:

- a. Flag raising;
- b. Programs or functions of the City Government of Baguio and of the barangays;
- c. Programs or activities initiated, sponsored or coordinated by or with the City Government of Baguio;
- d. Programs, celebrations or activities initiated or coordinated by government agencies based, stationed or holding offices in the City of Baguio;
- e. Programs, celebrations or activities initiated or coordinated by city registered accredited non-government organizations and civic oriented groups;
- f. Every sign-on or sign-off of all media stations; and
- g. The singing or playing of the said songs may also be made in city and tourism promotion activities of the City Government of Baguio in any place, as well as, in official city gatherings or meetings outside the City of Baguio:

NOW, THEREFORE, on motion of Hon. Bagbagen, duly seconded, be it

RESOLVED, as it is hereby resolved, to direct the singing of Baguio Hymn and Baguio March in all activities celebrated within the City of Baguio other than those specified under Sections 2 and 3 of Ordinance Numbered 052, Series of 1993 [Formally Adopting and Declaring the Musical Compositions Entitled, "*Baguio: Haven For All*" and "*Beautiful Baguio*" as the Official Baguio Hymn and Baguio March, Respectively].


