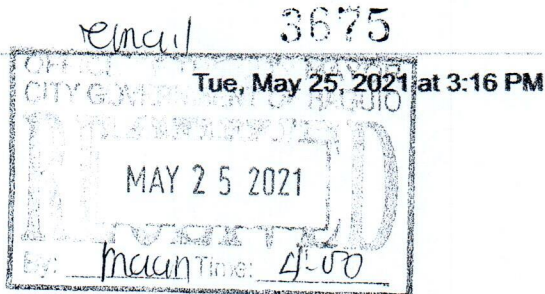




SUBJECT : Participation in the Conduct of Online Survey "*Telecommuting Preferences of Government Workers in the Philippines*"
