#### **MECHANICS:**

1. The competition will have three (3) age categories:

A. Children: 17 years old belowB. Women: 18 and aboveC. Youth: 18 - 30 years old

- 2. Participant will use phone in taking photos that will reflect the theme of the following celebrations:
  - a. For youth- 10th Juvenile Justice and Welfare Consciousness Week "Batang Handa at May Alam, Kaisa sa Pagharap sa Bagong Normal";
  - b. For children- National Children's Month theme "Normal na walang Iwanan: Karapatan ng bawat bata, ating tutukan; (eg. Photo of a child wearing mask while having a module with other 3 children in the library of barangay hall) and
- c. For women 18 Day Campaign to End Violence Against Women and Children theme "VAW Free Community Starts With Me".
- 3. Only one entry is allowed per participant with short description about the photo. Subject of photos can be individual or group of children/youth/women. Only phone is required to use to give consideration for participants without DSLR cameras.
- 4. - 5. In submitting your entry, please indicate your contact number. Late entries will be accepted however will subjected to deduction/s during the final competition or judging.
- 6. Advance editing used to create illusions, deceptions or any manipulation, and adding and removing of the significant elements within the frame is **prohibited**.
- 7. Photos depicting or otherwise including inappropriate and/or offensive content, such as provocative nudity, violence against human rights and/or environmental violations, as well as any other content deemed to be contrary to the law, religious, cultural, and moral traditions and practice, will immediately be discarded.

Design in relation to the theme	40%
Visual appeal	20%
Adherence to guidelines	10%
