

RESILIENT YOUTH:

Strengthening the role of young people in water resilience and urban climate initiatives

OVERALL BACKGROUND:

Accounting for over 70% of the world's greenhouse gas emissions, urban areas are centers of the fastest and largest transformations in population, consumption, resource use, and waste. However, these urban areas are also the important testbeds and multipliers of solutions.

WWF is committed to increasing political leadership, public engagement and entrepreneurship to transform cities. With the intention of supporting the creation and development of **One Planet Cities (OPC)** around the globe – cities that enable *all* people to thrive and prosper while respecting the ecological limits of our one and only planet, **OPC** aims to assist cities towards their transformation to an urbanizing, yet healthy and sustainable metropolitan areas.

In the Philippines, OPC aims to assist Philippine cities to have the capacities to implement inclusive climate actions in line with 1.5C global target and enhanced adaptive & resilient recovery plans by conducting local activities including public awareness, community engagement and capacity building of city stakeholders. With 16 Philippine cities partnering with WWF-Philippines in local implementation of the OPC project 2021-2022, we strive to continuously support them to realize their climate commitments and sustainability targets through participatory planning and collaborative actions.

Recognizing the vital role of the youth in shaping the city's future, it is important to educate and capacitate them to enhance their skills and abilities as future leaders and drivers of change. Equipped with knowledge and an enabling environment, this generation can create the path towards low-carbon and sustainable development of their communities, cities and countries. Rather than mere beneficiaries, the youth of today have the most at stake in how society responds to climate change and achievement of sustainable development goals.

Under the OPC project, WWF-Philippines designed an online activity for the Filipino urban youth. The **"One Planet, One Future (OPOF)"** is a **webinar series** for the cities' youth with **an overall objective of increasing their participation in climate-related activities that provide updated information on sustainability challenges, transformative climate actions, and urban resiliency to attain a one-planet future.** One of the highlights of this webinar series is the **"Youth in Action"** segment that **invites youth representatives to share their experiences and perspectives.**

Last 2021, the 1st and 2nd online sessions held last August 13 and November 5 respectively, were able to virtually gather **a total of 130 Zoom participants and 87 Facebook Live views** from all the 16 partner cities of the OPC project. This year, OPOF webinar will continue its remaining sessions for the youth which will mostly anchor on themes of upcoming environmental and sustainable events. Harnessing

Continuing with this concept, the 3rd part of the webinar series will be in celebration of this year's **"World Water Day"** with the theme of **"Groundwater – Making The Invisible Visible"** that aims to raise awareness on the critical role of groundwater resources in adapting to climate change and sustainable development. Entitled **"Resilient Youth: Strengthening the role of young people in water resilience and urban climate initiatives"**, this succeeding online activity of WWF-Philippines will be held on March 23, 2022 at 2:00 to 4:00PM via Zoom.



ACTIVITY OBJECTIVES

This two-hour webinar aims to gather once again all youth from the 16 partner cities of WWF-Philippines' One Planet Cities (OPC) project namely: (1) Batangas City, (2) Baguio City, (3) Cagayan de Oro City, (4) Davao City, (5) Dipolog City, (6) Legazpi City, (7) Makati City, (8) Ormoc City (9) Pasig City, (10) Quezon City (11) San Fernando City, La Union, (12) San Carlos City, Negros Occidental, (13) Santa Rosa City, (14) Tagum City, (15) Zamboanga City and (16) Vigan City.

It intends to provide an online platform for **the youth ages 15-30 of each city** - senior high school students, young professionals, SK members/officers and other local youth councils/organizations. Specifically, this second part of the virtual series has the following key objectives:

1. **Increase understanding of youth on water and its role in climate change adaptation and sustainability;**
2. **Discuss groundwater resources, use & management, including urban water cycle;**
3. **Present practical tips and initiatives on water conservation & efficiency; and**
4. **Provide avenue for inspiring community engagement and youth innovations**
