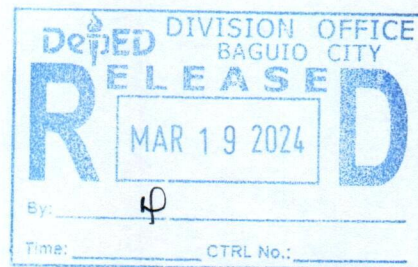


1. Pursuant to Memorandum DM-OUIOS-2024-11-01978, this office would like to inform the field that this innovative endeavour aims to support the DepEd's Career Guidance Program (CGP) by developing evidence-based, age appropriate, and culturally relevant teaching and learning resources for career guidance implementers.
2. Specifically, it intends to:
 - Shed light on how elementary-level career guidance implementers provide career guidance activities for key stage 1 learners and determine the needed teaching and learning resources that career guidance implementers can use to equip key stage 1 learners with age-appropriate career development skills;
 - Help in coming up with a baseline data/profile of public elementary-level career guidance implementers;
 - Provide inputs to the design and implementation of a holistic CGP for DepEd's K to 12 starting key stage; and
 - Create career guidance teaching and learning resources specifically designed for key stage 1 learners.
3. An online National Survey will be conducted from **March 15-29, 2024** to gather information about how elementary-level career guidance implementers provide career guidance activities for key stage 1 learners.

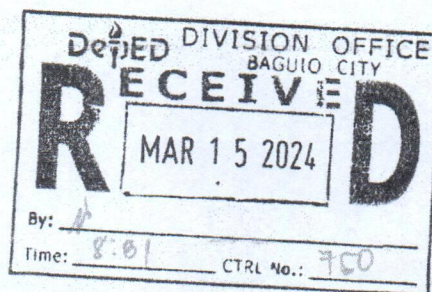



The Department of Education (DepEd), through the Bureau of Learner Support Services – Youth Formation Division (BLSS-YFD), in partnership with the Southeast Asian Ministers of Education Organization Regional Center for Educational Innovation and Technology (SEAMEO INNOTECH), will conduct a research and development project titled, **Career Development for Children (CD4C): Technical Assistance on Developing Career Guidance Resources for Key Stage 1.**

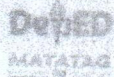
This innovative endeavor aims to support the DepEd’s Career Guidance Program (CGP) by developing evidence-based, age-appropriate, and culturally relevant teaching and learning resources for career guidance implementers.

Specifically, it intends to:

1. shed light on how elementary-level career guidance implementers provide career guidance activities for key stage 1 learners and determine the needed teaching and learning resources that career guidance implementers can use to equip key stage 1 learners with age-appropriate career development skills;

2. help in coming up with a baseline data/profile of public elementary-level career guidance implementers;
3. provide inputs to the design and implementation of a holistic CGP for DepEd's K to 12 starting key stage; and
4. create career guidance teaching and learning resources specifically designed for key stage 1 learners.

The project consists of two phases: the research phase and the development phase. The *research phase* intends to review how elementary-level career guidance implementers provide career guidance activities for key stage 1 learners and determine the needed teaching and learning resources that career guidance implementers can use to equip key stage 1 learners with age-appropriate career development skills. The *development phase*, on the other hand, will focus on creating career guidance teaching and learning resources specifically designed for key stage 1 learners.

Within the context of the research phase, an online national survey will be conducted from **March 15 to 29, 2024** to gather information about how elementary-level career guidance implementers provide career guidance activities for key stage 1 learners.

In this light, all **registered guidance counselors (RGCs), guidance counselors, and guidance designates of DepEd elementary schools** nationwide are enjoined to participate in this online survey. The online survey can be accessed through this link https://www.research.net/r/cd4c_nationalsurvey.
