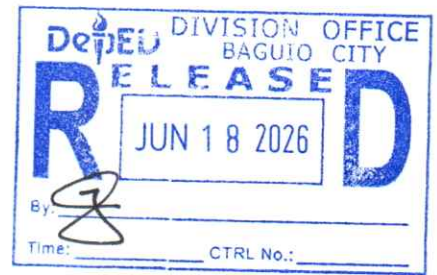

**LAUNCHING OF THE PANSA-NOPEN TAYO RESOURCE BOOK**

1. In support of Ordinance No. 15, s. 2026, titled "Pansa-nopen Tayo" Circular Economy, a Resource Book was developed through a collaborative effort of local government units, educational institutions, development partners, and community stakeholders. The book provides teachers with age-appropriate, locally relevant lesson exemplars and materials that integrate circular economy principles, indigenous knowledge, citizenship, and good governance across basic education. Its launch will strengthen circular economy education in Baguio City and the Cordillera by promoting environmental stewardship, responsible consumption, resource efficiency, and community participation rooted in local culture. The Resource Book will be launched on **23 June 2026, 8:00 a.m.–4:30 p.m.**, at the **Baguio Convention and Cultural Center**.

2. The launch aims to:
- Launch and promote the Circular Economy Resource Book by introducing its lesson exemplars to educators and partners, encouraging its adoption and use across schools, and fostering collective commitment to developing future circular economy champions.
  - Launch the CE Fellows Program to establish a pool of local circular economy practitioners and educators who can provide technical guidance, mentorship, and capacity-building support, ensuring the continued advancement of circular economy education beyond the resource book.
  - Strengthen educators' capacity to teach circular economy concepts by familiarizing school heads and teachers with the resource book's content and providing practical approaches for integrating circular economy principles into various subject areas and learning activities.
  - Promote meaningful and action-oriented learning by equipping educators with tools and strategies that help learners connect circular economy concepts to real-world challenges and opportunities within their communities.
